A message from the Sevenoaks Mayor, Councillor Nick Busvine OBE

I must begin on a sad note. We lost another World War 2 veteran and hero, Harry Garrett, in September. Harry reached the grand age of 101. He survived Dunkirk, he fought with the Desert Rats and had many narrow escapes. Since the war, he managed to raise over £60,000 for the Poppy Appeal. He took a close interest in the Pontoise Close play area. The Town Council planted a tree there in his honour to celebrate his 100th birthday. On behalf of Sevenoaks, I would like to pay tribute to and thank Harry for what he did both for his country and his local community.

To continue on the veteran theme, I attended a wonderful concert in Rochester Cathedral in aid of the veterans' charity, SSAFA, which I am supporting. The Cathedral was founded in AD604 by Justus, who was one of those who accompanied St. Augustine on his mission to convert southern England. A couple of weeks earlier, I attended the Justice Service for Kent at Canterbury Cathedral. What a wealth of history there is in our county.

Closer to home: there have been some excellent achievements to celebrate. The Bat and Ball Station refurbishment continues to draw plaudits, winning the Sevenoaks Society's Frank Marshall Award for Townscape Improvement jointly with Sevenoaks School's Science & Technology Centre and Global Study Centre. I opened the Bat & Ball ramp – that allows direct access for able and disabled passengers to Platform 1 from the Community Centre site. A big thank you to our Town Clerk, Linda Larter, and the amazing STC team for all their hard work on this.

Construction of the new Community Centre is getting underway – and Sir Michael Fallon and I buried a time capsule there to celebrate. I was also honoured to unveil the new Stag statue to celebrate 10 wonderful years since the Stag Theatre was rescued by the Town Council in 2009. Linda has been central to so many of these achievements – so it was wonderful to see her contribution recognised with her appointment as President of the Society of Local Council Clerks. Well done Linda!

Setting off a record-breaking number of runners for the Pink Week run in support of Breast cancer care was also very moving.

I gave gliding lessons on a beautiful September day to Mary Hogarth and Howard Rogers, who had both contributed generously to my charities.

Finally, I can't resist mentioning my solo attempt to imitate The Beatles Abbey Road zebra crossing walk – all in support of the wonderful Lewis project, which helps address mental health issues through music therapy. All you need is love...

Get yourself a plot at the Quaker's Hall Allotments and enjoy the health benefits you gain from growing your own produce

Imagine picking your own sun-kissed strawberries. How about sweet corn picked fresh and cooked just minutes later? Salad? You can have lettuce in June – and in January. Do you make your own jam? It tastes a lot better than store-bought and



better still when made with fruit from bushes you have lovingly tended yourself. As do freshly-dug potatoes and fresh brassicas, which could provide part of your five-a-day throughout the winter.

If this appeals to you, have you thought about having your own allotment? We currently have vacancies at the Quaker's Hall Allotments in Sevenoaks managed by Sevenoaks Town Council. If you start now, you could be harvesting your own produce by the summer.

Of course, having your own allotment requires time and effort and, like any farmer, you will sometimes battle with elements, be it the 'beast from the east' or the scorching summer of 2018. But the rewards of hard work and patience can be considerable, and you will have the pleasure of working with nature in a

beautiful environment where many of the plots offer stunning views of the North Downs.

For families, the allotments provide the ideal opportunity for little ones to engage with the natural environment and discover where some their food comes from; and that hard work in the fresh air also brings health benefits for young and old alike.

With many experienced growers on site you will also find that help and advice are never far away. Supplies are available at very reasonable prices from the allotment Trading Centre every Sunday, which is where the staff, volunteers from Sevenoaks Allotment Holders' Association (SAHA), are on-hand to answer your questions.

Time to celebrate at The Stag Theatre

Eagle-eyed visitors to The Stag will have recently spotted a new addition outside the Stag Plaza.

To recognise 10 years since Sevenoaks Town Council stepped in to rescue the arts venue, and to highlight its successes, guests gathered today (18th September) to help Mayor Nicholas Busvine OBE unveil a special stag statue.



The Stag Theatre, now a not-for-profit charity, has been proven to bring in around £7million to the local economy, and staff and volunteers work hard to continue to develop the venue. It sees more than 300,000 visits annually and remains open 364 days a year offering live shows, film screenings, community events and a café, while operating without local authority grants.

The event, which included Town Councillors, Stag staff and supporters, was also held to celebrate the second Stag Arts Festival, which took place in September. This year's line-up of special events included a cinema screening about Margaret Atwood's latest novel, a new play by the Stag Youth Theatre's leader Simon Cossons, a community art project, a painting workshop, the Page to Stage night of new plays, a dance festival and a local book launch.

New access ramp to Platform 1 opened by Sevenoaks Mayor

Sevenoaks Town Council has recently completed its refurbishment of Bat & Ball Station and opened the premises as part of the National Heritage Open Day on Saturday 21st September, linking the station to Knole via the use of many heritage buses all available free to ride, kindly provided by Go Coach. The Open Day was a great success enabling visitors to view the restored building and community art, listen to talks provided by the Thomas Crampton Society, sample the café and ride on the heritage buses.

The Town Council committed to regenerating the station and local area and a key part of this was providing a step-free access onto platform 1. To enable this to happen, the Town Council made available some of its land on the community centre site and made land agreements with Network Rail and Southeastern.

On Monday 30th September, local residents joined Sevenoaks Mayor, Cllr Nicholas Busvine OBE and Sir Michael Fallon for the official cutting the ribbon ceremony.

Bat & Ball Station was opened in 1862; however this is the first time that passengers will be able to access Platform 1 directly. This will be of help to those with mobility needs and parents with buggies.

The build was complicated due to the need to address train-related high voltage cables and other infrastructure. The construction cost of the ramp has been met by Sevenoaks Town Council's Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) receipts and Sevenoaks District Council CIL contribution of £54,852. CIL is a charge on most developments over a certain size to fund local infrastructure.

Memorial Tree Planting

The Town Council regularly works with members of the public to plant trees in memory of family and friends, and would welcome any interest in tree planting in general.

Trees can be formally planted with a remembrance plaque or as part of a wider planting scheme within a woodland or copse.
