

Happy new year from Councillor Nick Busvine OBE, Mayor of Sevenoaks

Since I last wrote in late October, we have had a somewhat eventful time on a national level, including a General Election and the passage of the Brexit Bill. Indeed, by the time this has been published, Brexit will have happened. I am proud to say that, whatever the individual views of councillors on these great issues of state, your Town Council has remained relentlessly focused on serving our local residents on local issues as well as we possibly can.

November kicked off with the firework night parade and spectacular display on Duke's Meadow. A big 'thank you' to the Round Table and Lions Club for organising and staging the event. November also saw a wellattended and moving Service of Remembrance on the



Vine. We were blessed with a beautiful, sunny, autumnal day. The Town Council team did a great job organising everything, and it was wonderful to see so many people

participating and supporting the event. I followed up by hosting an inaugural veterans' breakfast at the Bat and Ball Station venue. The veterans' charity, SSAFA, very kindly helped make this a success.

Speaking of Bat and Ball: I am absolutely delighted to say that the restoration project has now been recognised at a national level, winning - against stiff competition - the Arch Company Award for Urban Heritage. This is a genuinely extraordinary achievement and another feather in the cap for our Town Clerk, Linda Larter MBE, and her amazing team.

December also saw the Christmas lights switch-on celebration. It was a great success, and enjoyed by all who attended. Again, a brilliant organising job from the

Town Council team, and very welcome support from our sponsors: Manak Solicitors, Specsavers, Thackray Williams and Wettons Cleaning Services. It was very exciting - and slightly nervewracking - to be joined on stage by



the cast of Aladdin for the actual switch-on moment. But, I am relieved to report that my daughters did not find their father's fleeting moment in the limelight embarrassing. In fact, the whole thing was 'cool'. So that's alright then. The Panto itself was superb, with many fellow audience members telling me it was the best ever. The technical wizardry that the Stag Theatre is able to offer really is something to behold.

Looking to the future, I am pleased to report that work on the new Bat & Ball Centre [formerly the Community Centre] is progressing according to schedule. A group of councillors also visited the Greatness Tarmac site in mid-December. As many of you will know, this massive lakeside development will be the centre-piece of the proposed Neighbourhood Development Plan. It is really important that as many local residents as possible look at and comment on the plan. There is a six week consultation period that is set to run from Friday 31st January until Friday 13th March (details at:

https://sevenoaksndp.wordpress.com). Please do participate. We want to hear and factor-in your views!

As a council, we are now actively undertaking long-term planning to address the challenges associated with climate change. For example, we are looking at treeplanting, cycle policy and issues around the use of electric vehicles. As ever, we remain open to suggestions from local residents on how best to marshal our local response to this existential issue.

Inaugural veterans' breakfast



On Friday 22nd November the Mayor of Sevenoaks, Councillor Nick Busvine OBE, held an inaugural breakfast for Armed Forces veterans at the recently refurbished Bat & Ball Café in Sevenoaks. 20 veterans enjoyed bacon rolls and a chance to chat and meet with other service personnel in an informal setting.

The Mayor, who chose SSAFA as one of his charities, being an organisation close to his heart as a former diplomat who regularly served alongside the Armed Forces, said: 'It was an honour to meet so many former service personnel and humbling to hear their stories. I feel by enabling them to get together and share their experiences is a small but valuable contribution, particularly as representatives of SSAFA, who as the leading Armed Forces Charity, were present and able to provide advice and support if needed.'

Sevenoaks Town Council makes Climate Change and Carbon Neutral initiatives its No 1 Priority

The Town Council has recently resolved to formally recognise the Government and KCC declarations for aiming for Zero Carbon and to integrate this within the vision and throughout the emerging Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) and within the Town Council's general operation.

The Town Council will start work on creation of an Action Plan to review:

- Reducing cars / traffic particularly in relation to school traffic.
- STC new buildings to be as sustainable and eco-friendly as possible. Existing buildings to be improved to be more sustainable with reduced carbon footprint where practicable.
- Include planting of more trees, where possible fruit and nut trees.
- Continue to promote Refill Scheme and Sevenoaks Plastic Free Pledge.
- Cycle racks / planters to be installed.
- Install drinking fountains where possible at STC sites.
- Increased safety for pedestrians and cyclists.
- NDP Transport Strategy recommendations including 20 mph, one-way system in town centre and shared space.
- Link STC open spaces together with 'green routes'.
- Encourage increased use of public transport buses and trains by having improved facilities including live running information.
- Install electric car charging points at STC sites.
- Consider enabling community initiatives for sustainable living eg. Toy Library, Zero Waste Shop, Community Orchards, Community Cycle Workshops, Repair Café, promotion of alternative resources eg. nappies.

The Mayor of Sevenoaks, Councillor Nick Busvine OBE, planted an oak tree (*Quercus petrea*) on Sevenoaks Common on Thursday 28th November, during National Tree Week. This is the fourth of seven trees, one of which is planted annually by the mayor.

Previous mayors have planted oak trees on Brittains Common as a legacy for the town, after purchasing this land for the town in 2008, one each year for seven years, and they are growing well.

Sevenoaks Town Neighbourhood Plan



At the Sevenoaks Town Council Annual Public Town Meeting held on the 14th March 2013 residents signalled their support for the Town Council to produce a Neighbourhood Plan. The Plan is a once in a generation chance for local people to shape and guide the future of the town and to ensure that future development is sensitive to the town's character and identity and to provide for the needs of future generations.

Since 2013 the Town Council and the Neighbourhood Plan Committee have undertaken extensive public consultation and engagement activities, including a Masterplan for Northern Sevenoaks to ensure that the content of the plan reflects what local people want. They have used this information to develop background work for the Plan and commission strategies and studies to support the emerging plan policies.

A six-week public consultation is set to run from Friday 31st January 2020 until Friday 13th March 2020. The public consultation will be launched in the Sevenoaks Kaleidoscope Gallery on Buckhurst Lane on Friday 31st January and Saturday 1st February 2020. An exhibition will be available to view at the launch and at locations across the town through the six-week period (see below for details). Feedback from this initial consultation will be included where appropriate into the plan which will then be progressed through a statutory programme carried out by Sevenoaks District Council concluding in a referendum for the residents of Sevenoaks.

Gabby was presented with her Legacy Award by Earl Spencer, brother of Princess Diana, at a ceremony in London on 26th November 2019.
