Sevenoaks Town Council reveals its Green Community Investment Plan

In November 2019 Sevenoaks Town Council resolved to make the following its No 1 Priority:

- To recognise the Government and KCC declarations for aiming for Zero Carbon;
- To integrate this within the vision and throughout the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) and within the Town Council's general operation (list of initiatives agreed).

At a meeting in November 2021, Councillors met to review its original 2019 climate change initiatives and considered additional and new proposals. It was agreed that the Town Council should communicate more to the public about the practical local initiatives it was already undertaking and its plans for the future, and that the Town Council should take a leadership role, providing information about simple measures that can be taken in helping the local community to Reduce, Reuse and Recycle to help the planet.

In 2014 Sevenoaks Town Council set out its first ambitious £4m Community Investment Plan to restore and improve community facilities. Building on the success of the Community Investment Plan a second was produced in

2019 which increased the investment to £6.5m.

The Sevenoaks Town Council Green Community Investment Plan here moves away from primarily investing in community buildings and facilities and towards investing in the local environment and making Sevenoaks greener.

Cllr Dr Marilyn Canet said: *"The Green Investment Plan for Sevenoaks was approved for wider consultation with residents and businesses at the Christmas Town Council meeting on Monday. At the same meeting a brilliantly delivered and researched presentation by students from Sevenoaks started the meeting and included ideas for making the centre of the Town more people friendly and the Stag attractive to younger residents. Everyone has the opportunity to contribute to the Green Investment Plan and I hope they will. Action is needed now to protect our environment."*

Sevenoaks Town awarded £80,000 grants for play area improvements

Sevenoaks Town Council has been awarded grants totalling £80,000 for improvements to the play areas at Hillingdon Rise and at Julian's Meadow.

Sevenoaks Town Council's goal is to create free spaces where children and parents can go to experience the outdoors and escape the rushed pace of life.

The grants awarded by Enovert Community Trust will be used to update, refurbish and extend the play areas at each site.

In line with the Town Council's commitment to finding sustainable solutions and protecting the environment, some existing equipment will be refurbished. The improved play

areas and additional equipment will cater to a wider range of ages and abilities. The projects will commence in May 2022 and are scheduled in to open in early summer.

Enovert Community Trust is a grant-making organisation which is funded by landfill tax credits. It supports projects in the vicinity of landfill sites, and projects that benefit and make a positive impact to the community.

The Chairman of the Open Spaces and Leisure Committee, Cllr Nicholas Busvine OBE, said: *"A very big thank you to the Enovert Community Trust for £80,000 grant funding. Wonderful news to end the year!"*

In a record-breaking year for the Green Flag Award, as the scheme marks its Silver Jubilee, The Vine is one of 2127 celebrating success!

After almost two years that have seen our parks and green spaces play a vital role for people through lockdowns as a place to relax, exercise and meet friends and family safely, the news that The Vine has achieved the Green Flag Award is testament to the hard work and dedication of the team that make the green space a great space that everyone can enjoy.



The Vine joins parks and green spaces as diverse as the National Memorial Arboretum in Staffordshire, Woodhouse Park in Peterlee and Chiswick Old Cemetery in London.

The Green Flag Award scheme, managed by environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy under licence from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities, recognises and rewards well-managed parks and green spaces, setting the benchmark standard for the management of green spaces across the United Kingdom and around the world.

The Chairman of Sevenoaks Town Council's Open Spaces Committee said: 'The Green Flag award for The Vine is excellent news, and follows hard on the heels of the Gold standard obtained in the South & South East In Bloom contest. This is a wonderful achievement by Town Council staff and local volunteers. Thank you all.'

Local business discovers perfect volunteering opportunity at the Stag in Sevenoaks

Sevenoaks Town Council's request for people to help with gardening in the Town has not gone unnoticed.

One volunteer, Bonnie Tarling, an employee of Solicitors Thackray Williams in Sevenoaks, has stepped forward to provide regular gardening help at the Stag and, more specifically, outside the Plaza Suite.

The hope is that this will become regular work keeping ahead of the weeds and slowly improving the whole site. The Open Spaces team at Sevenoaks Town Council will work closely with Bonnie and other volunteers to support with removal of weeds, supplying of plants, and providing guidance with planting and design.

Volunteers are asked to give their time and energy and get involved with a range of different projects around Sevenoaks Town including practical tasks like clean-ups and planting, general gardening and weeding, and litter picking.

The request and need for volunteers in 2022 is needed even more than before to help Sevenoaks bloom during the special Queen's Platinum Jubilee Year.

Lloyds Bank employees volunteer in historic Sevenoaks Common

Sevenoaks Town Council is grateful to the staff from Lloyds Bank who recently volunteered on Sevenoaks Common.

On Tuesday 9 November 2021, a group of 30 volunteers from Lloyds Bank planted approximately 150 saplings of Hornbeam and Blackthorn in an area of ancient woodland in Sevenoaks Common.

The volunteering day, organised by **Employee Volunteering**, worked to plant understorey trees to thicken the boundary, whilst also providing dense cover for small birds and mammals. This work continued the valuable work carried out by the Greensand Project volunteers two years ago, which saw the removal of invasive Rhododendron and Cherry Laurel. The trees were provided free of charge by the Woodland Trust.

Employee Volunteering helps companies develop, implement, and deliver dynamic and rewarding employee volunteering programmes globally. They can offer physical team volunteering opportunities for teams of five to over 1,000 colleagues at multiple locations on one day or across the year.

Volunteers Wanted

Sevenoaks District Independent Police Advisory Group (IPAG) is looking for people to volunteer to help represent diverse communities across Sevenoaks District and to assist Kent Police with its work in supporting victims of crime.

Residents have the opportunity to join the IPAG, which acts as a critical friend to Kent Police, Sevenoaks District, West Division.

The group is totally independent of the force and helps improve the services police provide to people from different backgrounds.

It includes volunteers who can offer their perspectives around issues such as race, sexual orientation, disability, age and gender.

The IPAG provides a platform and an opportunity to engage, consult and discuss the impact of policing on communities in your local district.

Members are able to share feedback to Kent Police from the communities and local areas they represent, as well as give advice and support during critical incidents.

The IPAG also includes people from minority groups and diverse backgrounds; volunteers have the opportunity to bring along independent thoughts and views to which Kent Police will listen and respond.

Sevenoaks Town Council Precept 2022/23

As a precautionary measure, Sevenoaks Town Council used its Christmas Council meeting to set a Council Tax precept for 2022/23.

Cllr Tony Clayton, Chairman of the Finance & General Purposes Committee says: *"To make sure that it can continue to deliver services through next year, Sevenoaks Town Council used its Christmas Council meeting to set a Council Tax precept for 2022/23. Although the decision isn't required for another six weeks, it has to be made by Councillors meeting in person, which could be difficult if Covid continues to grow in January.*

"After hard work to look at a range of options by our officers, the Town Council has agreed an increase which will raise its tax for each household by just over 3.2%. For a Band D house that means an increase from £128.50 per year to £132.67, a rise of 8 pence per week.

"As the Bank of England expects inflation to hit 6% by April this won't be easy, but Councillors didn't think it was reasonable to expect taxpayers to bear all the costs at a time when many are still suffering continuing income loss from the pandemic.

"With careful management, and by promoting the Council's community assets at the newly reopened Bat & Ball Centre, and its cafes at The Vine and Bat and Ball station, we aim to deliver all the Council's services to local residents and have a contingency which could cover possible risks. We also have capital reserves left after making the major investments at Bat & Ball, on play areas and sports pitches, on the Neighbourhood Plan, Stag, and the Business Hub, to start supporting some of the Green Investment Plan initiatives just published.

"Our aim is to do all this without having to dip into the Council's revenue reserves, which are now moving back towards a safe level."

In 2018 Sevenoaks Town Council placed a request with the House of Commons for Hope, the Suffragette made from Lego, to visit Sevenoaks to commemorate the centenary of women receiving the vote. Unfortunately, this was delayed until the end of 2021 due to the pandemic.



Standing at 170cm tall and consisting of over 30,000 bricks, Hope was built in 2018 to help tell the story of woman's suffrage. Celebrating the success in getting the vote for women, the impressive Lego statue will be travelling to every region and nation in the UK by 2028.

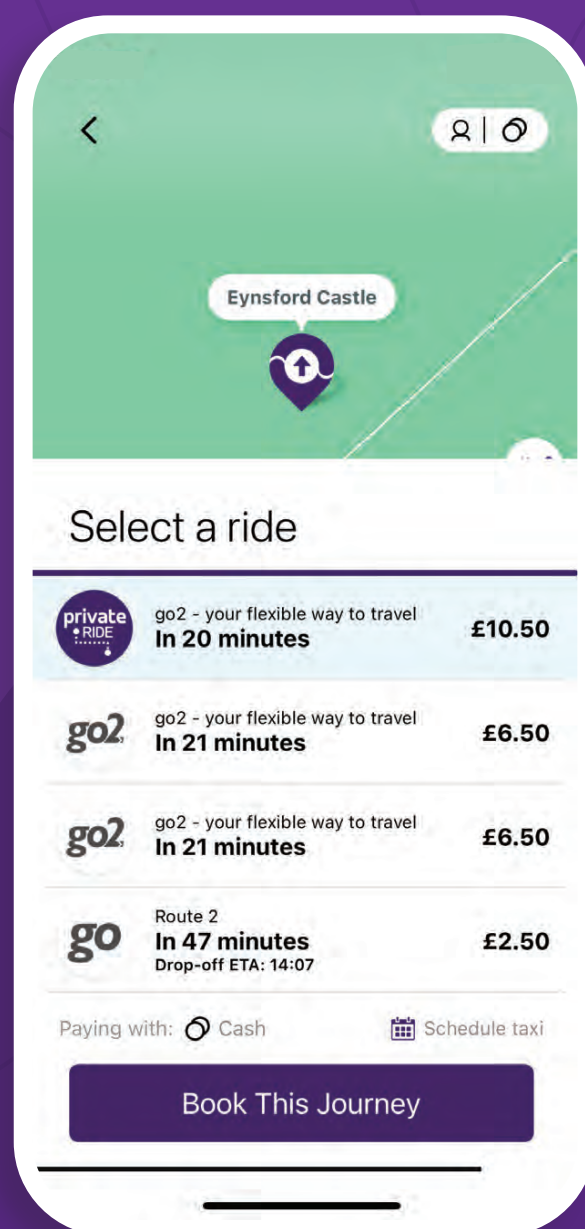
