From the Mayor of Sevenoaks, Councillor Claire Shea

As I write in the middle of the school holidays, I find it hard to believe looking out of the window that it is the summer holiday rather than the spring break.

It is a source of huge pride to us all at Sevenoaks Town Council to have been accredited as a **Town of Sanctuary**, and we are the first town level council to be recognised. You may have seen the flag which we flew at the Vine to celebrate it when it was announced, very aptly, at the beginning of Refugee Week.

The City of Sanctuary scheme describes itself as a 'movement of welcome', building a network of places, people and organisations who greet refugees with compassion and open arms. Our application for Town of Sanctuary status was made in close collaboration with **Sevenoaks Welcomes Refugees**, whose selfless dedication to supporting people arriving in our area in dire circumstances is truly inspiring, and this recognition is testament the the work of their members, landlords, schools, clubs and others who make the town open and welcoming. Thank you.

You may have spotted another flag recently at the Vine for the first time, a **Pride flag** marking Pride Month flew there in June. Indeed, the Vine has been a busy place all summer, with the welcome return of the **Sevenoaks Lions' Beer Festival**, a personal favourite, as well Music nights on the bandstand, which I hope you have had a chance to enjoy.

At Town Council, we have a number of initiatives underway to benefit the town. First of all, ten years after the last one was prepared for the Neighbourhood Development Plan process, we are reviewing the **Sports Strategy** for the town. Much has changed in ten years, with three new secondary schools, several enlarged primary schools, and football, rugby and hockey clubs achieving great things, to name but a few. Our strategy will review all the existing facilities, consider the strengths, weaknesses and gaps and look at ways to support sport in Sevenoaks.

We are also working closely with Sevenoaks Town FC on their facilities at **Greatness Park**. The club has permission for a new stadium, making it the right time to look at the whole park. Town Council has recently committed funds to refurbishing the skate park, and the playground is due for



refurbishment. We have put together a consultation on the proposals and would love to hear your views.

Kent County Council has a tool for Parish and Town Councils to work with them on roads known as **Highways Improvement Plans**. We have re-written our plan to reflect needs of pedestrians, cyclists and motorists across the wards of the town, and we will be working with KCC officers on costing and designing solutions for the council to consider.

In July, residents of Northern Ward returned to the polls for a by-election for an unfilled Town Council seat, and we are pleased to **welcome Cllr Lionel O'Hara** as a result.

SEVENOAKS TOWN NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Since its successful Referendum and subsequent adoption by the Local Planning Authority in May 2023, the Sevenoaks Town Neighbourhood Plan (STNP) has achieved the following notable successes:

- Helped the Planning Inspector of Land South of Little Brittains, Brittains Lane in her decision to DISMISS the Appeal to build 70 new homes in the Green Belt and Conservation Area.
- Requires a Biodiversity Net Gain of 10% by developers—including at the proposed demolition and redevelopment site of Pinehurst House Nursing Home, Pinehurst, which is currently being re-appealed. This requirement is not yet required by government planning policy and without it, the development would have resulted in a -20.64% net LOSS in biodiversity. This will now need to be offset either by additional measures, or a financial contribution to provide the net gain offsite.
- Supported the District Council in its refusal of 5 planning applications, primarily on grounds of harm to the character area and Conservation Area and protection of heritage assets. Also supported ~41 grants of planning permission by the District Council.
- Secured the provision of various community benefits at 13 potential sites identified as likely to come forwards for development, including a Watersports lake at Sevenoaks Quarry (Tarmac site).
- Resulted in £1.2m invested into sports provision in Sevenoaks Town since the first Sports Strategy was completed in 2015.

Greatness Recreation Ground Survey -Current Use and Future Improvements

Sevenoaks Town Council are working to improve amenities for local residents to ensure that they continue to reflect the needs of the community, and are currently looking at Greatness Recreation Ground.

During the past few weeks and to enable this to be done effectively, we have been seeking views of local people to ascertain how people use the facilities and what they would like to see improved in the future.

A key partner in this work is Sevenoaks Town Football Club (STFC). STFC provide competitive and recreational football sessions for over 1000 local residents and also run specific Women, Girls, Inclusive and Walking Football Sessions at the Bourne Stadium, which is located on Mill Lane.

STFC are working with Sevenoaks Town Council to build a new and improved community pavilion (as image shown) as the Stadium which will support football and community provision whilst also freeing up the existing pavilion for alternative community use.



The image (left) shows the Proposed new and improved community pavilion, as approved via planning application referenced 20/03804/FUL.

We would be grateful for your opinion as to the future improvements proposed and being considered for the Greatness Recreation Ground facilities.


