Police Commissioner: Police Commissioner Matthew Scott gave a frank and honest presentation and answered all of the questions asked of him from the committee members and members of the general public. He has promised to follow-up on some of the reported incidents and has asked to be invited back for an update next year. He emphasised the importance of reporting <u>all</u> crimes to the police.

3. Minutes

The minutes of the Sevenoaks Town Partnership meeting held on 8th October were received and agreed subject to the following amendment:

Minute 12: Sevenoaks Society update should state a petition has been started requesting a compulsory purchase order on the Farmers site.

4. Member Organisations

Specsavers – Were experiencing a busy time and were starting to prepare for Christmas.

Go-Coach – From Monday 18th November all buses would be renumbered from 1 to 8.

Senior Actions Forum – It was reported that they were very busy. As well as looking for homes for older people, there were worries regarding transportation for the elderly. Isolation and loneliness were also high on the agenda of things to tackle.

Sevenoaks Society – Reported the petition was going well in regards the Farmers Pub site in Tubbs Hill.

Chamber of Commerce – They recently experienced their busiest event with an attendance of over 90 people. They would be holding a Member Feedback Forum to

help identify the services most needed by their members. Their Christmas Lunch would be held at Knole Park Golf Club on the 12th December.

Knole – Would be holding a Book Festival on the weekend of the 16th and 17th November. This will result in the car park being closed to the general public as all parking would be reserved for ticket holders of the event. Go-Coach would provide a free shuttle bus which would run from all the town car parks to Knole.

Francis Jones – Reported they were busy and preparing for Christmas.

Warners – Business was generally very busy in the run up to Christmas.

Pink Week – An approximate figure of £14,000 was expected to be raised for 2019. Money was still coming in and a final figure should be available by the end of November.

Sevenoaks Town Council – November had been a busy time with STC supporting the Round Table's Torchlight Parade. Remembrance Day and Armistice Day proved to be very well supported by the people of Sevenoaks. Also the team was very busy preparing for the Christmas Lights Switch-On on the 29th November.

Stag – The beautiful Stag at the entrance to the Stag Plaza had now been named. A competition to choose a name, which was run by the Stag, with the help of Sevenoaks Community, resulted in Oakley being the most popular choice. The Arts Festival held in September went very well, as did the recent production of Jesus Christ Superstar. The film 'Joker' had been a huge success. The Panto 'Aladdin' would see Director Jamie Wilson taking the role of Abanazar.

Update on recent projects:

• Small Business Saturday

The Small Business Saturday initiative, held on the 7th December 2019, was not well received by independent traders. Despite many promises of special offers and deals the response was very poor. Maybe six or seven traders came up with ideas, but many felt it a waste of time ands were not excited about offering special deals because of a day set aside. Some businesses thought the bus which came into the town was just a stunt and as it only worked with four businesses wasn't helpful. We have discussed doing something on a bigger level with our own initiative.

Hygiene Bank Collection

Just before Christmas we joined forces with Lizzy Hall, Sevenoaks resident and founder of The Hygiene Bank, for their Christmas campaign. We called upon residents and staff members to contribute towards this initiative and we were happily surprised by just how popular it proved to be. Lizzy was thrilled to come and collect the items and was overawed by just how much was collected in such a short space of time. We hope to be involved in more of the Hygiene banks initiatives in 2020.



Refill Scheme

Our refill scheme is now very popular within the town, with 15 businesses already taking part and more looking to join-up. The scheme is most popular during the summer months, so we hope to get more of the businesses to stock the Sevenoaks Town Partnership bottle prior to this summer.
