Sevenoaks Town Council's Number 8 bus and Vintage Bus WIN the Transport



Planning Society's People's Choice Award!

Two local bus services operated by Sevenoaks Town Council, Route 8 and the Vintage Bus, have overcome stiff competition from across the UK to win the inaugural People's Award, announced by the Transport Planning Society on 10th October 2018.

The Award recognises the most significant transport planning initiatives of the year. The organisers invited communities to demonstrate how transport planning projects, whatever they might be, had made a positive impact in their local area.

Working with Go Coach Ltd the Vintage Bus Service, established in 2011, has been a hit with Sevenoaks locals as well as tourists. The circular route takes in local landmarks including the National Trust property Knole, The Stag theatre and cinema, The Vine, and Blighs shopping centre.

Meanwhile, the No 8 bus service again working with Go Coach Ltd – available free of charge for 11-18-year-olds – now attracts thousands of passengers every year, and supports older people struggling with loneliness.

Councillor Richard Parry, Leader of the Majority Group at Sevenoaks Town Council, said: "These bus routes are part of a large range of measures we have put in place to improve connectivity for Sevenoaks residents, and attract new people to the town. We have been delighted to see both initiatives prove so popular, and this recognition confirms that our work has been worthwhile."

Lynda Addison OBE, Chair of the Transport Planning Society, said: "We're delighted with the wide range of entries we received from communities across the UK. It was very hard to reach a final shortlist and the calibre of submissions was good. The whole process – from judging to the final winner – sends a positive message to professionals about what is important to communities in terms of transport and best practice in community engagement in transport planning. This award recognises the projects and initiatives that have made a genuine contribution to improving people's accessibility, quality of life and wellbeing and have made such a huge difference to their local communities."

During 2019 the No 8 bus route will be extended to Otford Road to enable passengers easier access to Aldi and Sainsbury's.
