Extraordinary community effort for Britain in Bloom

he Sevenoaks community came together for RHS Britain in Bloom, as school pupils, gardening volunteers, local businesses, crafters, and the Town Council's Open Spaces team all went the extra mile to make the town look stunning in preparation for the national finals. Volunteers aged from two to 100 helped with Sevenoaks in Bloom's campaign.

Charming knitted bugs were exhibited around the town, made by crafters including from Rockdale Housing Association, Knole U3A, Knit and Natter and Sevenoaks Soroptimists.

Decorated rocks were displayed at the Vine painted by local children, including from Sevenoaks Day Nursery and 15th Sevenoaks (Otford) Beaver Scouts.

Sevenoaks Soroptimists tended to flowerbeds at the Vine and station.

Rockdale Housing Association residents and staff put in 1,000 hours of volunteer work in their garden! Pupils from Walthamstow Hall School and tots from

Mayor shares event highlights and plans for a greener Sevenoaks

t's been a busy summer! I hope many of you have enjoyed events in Sevenoaks as much as I have, from all the performances at Sevenoaks Summer Festival, the Sevenoaks Business Show, all the Bandstand concerts on the Vine, the Skate Jam at Greatness which drew a big crowd, Family Fun Day and children's theatre shows at our parks all around the town.

A huge thank you to the volunteers who helped to make all this happen, supporting Town and District Council staff. And special thanks to all the volunteers and schools who put so much time and effort into the Town Council's Britain in Bloom entry. You did a lot of work to show Sevenoaks at its best and it really made a difference. We will discover very soon how well we impressed the judges.

The Vine has already retained its Green Flag Award as one of the most attractive green spaces in Britain. New access friendly surfacing around the pond in Vine Gardens - gravel bonded by resin from over one million recycled plastic straws has also drawn favourable comment.

There's more to come. Sevenoaks Bike Festival will be running at Vine Gardens on 20 September, following its success last year. Sevenoaks Literary Festival starts on 26 September with a great programme of talks and readings - see pages 8 and 9. The Vegan Market will also be back on Vine Gardens on 4 October.

The Town Council's next big project coming up is the new Football Pavilion at Greatness. With funding now in place from the Football Foundation, Community Infrastructure Levies from developers, and smaller contributions from the Council

and the Premier League Stadium Fund, we've started the procurement process. Work on site should start around October. The Council will also renew and relocate the children's play area as part of this exciting development. Read more on page 5.

Our holiday in Brittany, timed to watch the start of the Women's Tour de France, made me look at what's going on there to encourage cycling. The town of Brest runs an e-bike share scheme which allows you to hire an e-bike for about £300 a year - then to buy it for another £350 if you'd like to keep it.

It's made a real impact as hills in

Brittany are as steep as in Sevenoaks. A local business has offered to help sponsor an e-bike scheme in Sevenoaks - based on their good experience as users in other UK towns where they operate. What do you think? You can send us your thoughts by emailing communityeng@ sevenoakstown.gov.uk

Dartford Road zebra crossing update


riginally intended for delivery in tandem with the 20mph scheme in 2024, the zebra crossing at Dartford Road was delayed due to time constraints and the need for a further Road Safety Audit and detailed designs to be produced.

We are pleased to say that this stage is finally complete, with the detailed plans having been consulted on by Kent County Council in July, and the following funding secured towards its delivery:

• £25k from Sevenoaks Town Council. This is from Developer contributions we have received from planning applications (Community Infrastructure Levy).

- £20k from Sevenoaks District Council, applied for by Sevenoaks Town Council.
- £55k from Active Travel England, applied for by Kent County Council.

We await the results of the consultation from Kent County Council, with construction hoped to take place by the end of 2025.



Masterplans for Town Centre and St John's Hill



Town Centre Masterplan

Consultation on our draft Town Centre Masterplan will remain open until 30 September.

The Masterplan is a spatial exploration of how the town centre could potentially be improved.

St John's Hill Masterplan

We consulted on our draft St John's Hill Area Masterplan in March and April this year, and our consultants are now reviewing and updating the contents in line with feedback.

Give your views: should Town Council request transfer of local assets from District Council?

entral Government has requested that District and Borough Councils - being one tier above Sevenoaks Town Council - make plans to merge with a number of their neighbours into several new, larger Unitary Councils. As part of this process, the expectation is that all of the District Council's currentlyowned assets would be transferred to this new Unitary - alongside those of its counterparts.

In a bid to protect key local assets, Sevenoaks District Council has initiated a protocol for considering asset-transfer applications from its Town and Parish Councils – the second "tranche" of which is due to open to new applications in September 2025. Sevenoaks Town Council is seeking local views on which, if any, District Council-owned assets local residents believe would benefit from being transferred to more local, centralised ownership.

Please respond to the survey using the QR code provided. This survey will remain open indefinitely, as any responses received after the District Council's submission deadline of 30 October could still be instrumental in demonstrating local support for any further asset requests, and potentially securing their retention.



New Football and Community Pavilion at Greatness Recreation Ground

evenoaks Town Council and Sevenoaks Town Football Club have secured additional grant funding to support the exciting plans for a new Football and Community Pavilion at Greatness Recreation Ground, and construction should start around October.

The Premier League, The FA and Government's Football Foundation approved a grant for £759,100, and the Premier League Stadium Fund is providing funding of £150,000.

Sevenoaks Town Football Club Chairman, Paul Lansdale, commented, "Years of hard work has paid off with the news of this funding for the building of our long-awaited clubhouse. The Football Foundation has agreed to provide a significantly larger figure than we expected."

Between Sevenoaks Town Football Club and Sevenoaks Town Council, just under £2m external funding has been obtained for this project.

Mayor of Sevenoaks Cllr Tony Clayton commented, "This will be a new asset for the town, accompanied by other improvements to the Rec, and a real gain for sports people of all ages. We recognise local concerns about increased traffic, and I look forward to being able to access the new Pavilion safely by bike."

The new Greatness Recreation Ground Football and Community Pavilion will be built close to the 3G pitch, and will



include changing rooms, kitchen and refreshment areas and other facilities. It will incorporate a green roof and living wall. The current brick pavilion will be released for community use.

Community celebrates revamp of Vine Gardens

evenoaks Town Council has completed an exciting revamp of the pond and pergola area of the Vine Gardens. The space has been revitalised with a new ground surface,



made up of a mix of stone and recycled plastic waste. The equivalent of 1,074,000 recycled plastic straws was used in the surface. The new anti-slip surface not only looks smart and has environmental benefits, but it will also reduce long-term maintenance costs.

The project has received rave reviews from the community. One mum, Lisa Frost, was particularly delighted, thanks to the positive impact it has had on her son, Oakley. She commented, "It's things like this that improve access for my complex needs disabled son. We will now be able to get his wheelchair in there much more easily and he will be able to take his steps holding our hand without tripping. This sort of thing makes such a huge difference to his life."

The Vine recently received a Green Flag Award for the 9th year running. This award is the international quality mark for parks and green spaces.

Cllr Dr Merilyn Canet (pictured right), Chair of the Community Asset Committee at Sevenoaks Town Council,



commented, "The Vine is a historic and important green area of Sevenoaks. Many residents of all ages enjoy playing, walking and listening to music from the Bandstand at the Vine. Cricket has been played here for over two hundred years, which I trust will continue.

The Green Flag Award recognises the pleasure that the Vine gives to the town and the hard work that the Town Council team puts into maintaining it."



Sevenoaks in Bloom top tip: water wisely!



Watering 'little and often' wastes water: some of the water will be lost to evaporation, and plants roots will need more water as they stay close to the surface where the soil dries out faster.

Wise watering is about applying a good amount of water that goes deeper, 20 cm or more, encouraging roots to follow so that watering can be less frequent.

For a newly planted tree, between 20 – 50 litres a week (depending on size of tree) is optimal in dry periods; rainwater is ideal, but grey water (like bath or washing-up water) can also be used.

When watering established trees and shrubs, the water should be applied around the edge of the canopy as this is where the finer roots, that take up water, will be growing.

This advice applies to plants that are grown in the soil; plants in containers will need more regular watering as their roots have limited space.

You can improve the amount of water your soil can hold on to by mulching with well-rotted farmyard manure (which can be bought in 50 litre bags from garden centres, or delivered in bulk bags to your door), or better still, your own home-made compost of leaf mould. By looking after your soil you will be looking after your plants... and saving money!
