Town Council seeks to protect community spaces

s plans progress for Local Government Reorganisation, the Town Council wants to protect the community assets that make Sevenoaks such a wonderful town.

Sevenoaks District Council will be disbanded and merged into a new Unitary Authority covering several districts. The Town Council is concerned about the future of the community assets the District Council currently operates. The default position is that these would move to the Unitary Authority.

The Town Council believes that keylocal assets would be best owned and managed locally. It has so far provided Expressions of Interest to the District Council for the transfer of: the Stag (pictured), Hollybush Recreation Ground, Land at Bradbourne Vale Road, Land and Market Rights in the High Street, St John's Hill Car Park, St James Road Car Park, Bradbourne Lakes (pictured) and The Shambles. The Town Council is now preparing business cases outlining reasons and intentions for acquiring these sites.

STAG THEATRE

Sevenoaks District Council officers initially recommended giving the Town Council a 100-year lease for the Stag,

but the Town Council is seeking the freehold to ensure the community retains this cultural facility.

The Town Council has exciting plans for the Stag, but with only the lease, any improvements would need permission. The Unitary Authority could also demand a rent that makes the Stag operationally unviable. The proposed lease also excludes the vital car parking area.

At a recent Sevenoaks District Council Cabinet meeting, Councillors were in favour of transferring the freehold to the Town Council. The District and Town Council are now working together to address any concerns from the auditor.



Mayor applauds voluntary initiatives and looks ahead to busy festive season

s I write this, it seems early to think about Christmas, but decorations are already in the shops. Sevenoaks Town Council is planning the great Christmas Lights Switch-On for Saturday 29 November. We are repeating last year's success to make it a family-friendly afternoon event (see page 4).

The High Street will be closed after lunch to allow safe pedestrian shopping. There will be stalls and entertainment in the town centre. Then, just as it gets dark, I pop up with our stage entertainers and turn the lights on. With luck, you might catch sight of Father Christmas. Don't miss it.

It's a long time since the summer programme on The Vine, with 13 concerts and 25 events drawing thousands of visitors. Sevenoaks Street Food Festival (see page 13) and the final bandstand concerts were brilliant.

Three of the most impressive events I've been invited to recently were run

by volunteers. These and many other volunteer and charitable groups are what make Sevenoaks such a special place to live:

- The tenth anniversary of Forgetme-not Cafés, which run in seven different locations each month to give those living with dementia and their carers a place to socialise and meet new people (see page 8).
- Sevenoaks Literary Festival, which opened with a schools event at Sevenoaks Primary, with award winning children's author, Sita Brahmachari, who was inspired to write by her childhood in the Lake District.
- Walking blindfolded down Sevenoaks High Street on a busy Thursday morning with Guide Dogs for the Blind Association, first with a white cane, then with Monty, a very friendly black Labrador cross guide dog, which was much less terrifying.

Three weeks ago, I was privileged to take part in the 350th birthday of a Sevenoaks charity set up by Lady Margaret Boswell to support a school for the very poorest students. The whole of Lady Boswell's School was in Rochester Cathedral to hear how free education came to Sevenoaks 200 years before most of England. That's a huge and lasting legacy.

Another historical record I'm proud to support is Bob Ogley's new book on the history of Knole Park. Many histories have been written about Knole House and the people who lived in it, but the Park is older still. It has shaped Sevenoaks for centuries, and still does.

Bob, who was editor of Sevenoaks Chronicle for many years, lived as a youngster within 200 yards of the park, so knows most of the last 70 years first-hand.

I plan to sponsor a talk by Bob on 2 December at 4pm, in the Orangery at Knole, to help support local charities Sevenoaks Area Youth Trust and Sevenoaks Citizens Advice. Come along and buy the book as a Christmas present

- even if it's for yourself!

Have your say on proposed corner protections


Ithough it isn't the Local Highway Authority, Sevenoaks Town Council often receives community requests for more double yellow lines, particularly corner protections, on various roads.

The Highway Code stipulates that cars may not park within 10 metres of a junction or bend on the grounds that it obstructs visibility, so the proposed double yellow lines would solely enforce existing restrictions.

The Town Council has consolidated a list of proposed corner protection locations, and we are now seeking residents' views before pursuing a formal Traffic Regulation Order.

Commemorative plaques mark where World War II bombs fell in Sevenoaks

To commemorate the 80th anniversary of VE and VJ Day, Sevenoaks Town Council has been installing plaques around the town to mark sites where bombs fell during the Second World War.

The idea for this project came from Bob Ogley, a local historian and author, who recently published 'Sevenoaks 1940'.

The Town Council is pleased to support this heritage initiative to acknowledge the events that shaped Sevenoaks during the war, and is placing plaques at:

- Walthamstow Hall on Holly Bush Lane - where a former gymnasium was destroyed in an air raid
- Bus Station, Buckhurst Lane the site of cottages destroyed by bombing
- Boots Opticians, High Street marking the destruction of Youngs Furniture Depository

• Vine Gardens – the site of Sevenoaks Club Hall lost during the war.

Headmistress of Walthamstow Hall, Louise Chamberlain, said, "At Waltham-

stow Hall, we are proud to be part of the history of Sevenoaks. The plaque installed by our main entrance marks the destruction of our Gymnasium and Science labs following a direct bomb hit during the Second World War. As a scientist myself, I am delighted that this loss did not deter the girls from continuing to pursue Science with enthusiasm. This plaque is an inspirational reminder of the resilience of a generation of staff and pupils."

Exciting plans for new and improved play areas

he Town Council is upgrading two existing play areas: Buckhurst Lane, with an investment of £25,000, and Kippington Meadow, where £5,000 has been allocated.

Following the Town Council's lease renewal of Buckhurst Play Area, the Town Council can now invest in much-needed improvements. The surface area under the zip wire has been replaced, we are repairing current play equipment and we are also installing new pieces, including a seesaw

and springers. The park recently suffered vandalism with fences being damaged, but these have now been replaced. We hope the community will enjoy the renovated play area.

At Greatness Recreation Ground, £250,000 has been earmarked for a new, relocated play area, planned for 2026.

A playground design featuring improved accessibility will soon undergo public consultation. Keep an eye on our website and social media for more information about the consultation soon.

Works start on Greatness Community Sports Pavilion

Sevenoaks Town Council and Sevenoaks Town Football Club are working in partnership to deliver an exciting new community sports pavilion at Greatness Recreation Ground, and construction has now begun. The project is due to be completed by August 2026.

This £2m+ project aims to bring economic, social, and environmental benefits to the local community.

The project has been funded by the Premier League, The FA and Government's Football Foundation, Premier League Stadium Fund, Sevenoaks Town Football Club, Sevenoaks Town Council, and Community Infrastructure Levy contributions.

The pavilion will include modern changing rooms, a kitchen, small gym, as well as a café and refreshment areas.



Forget-me-not Cafés charity celebrates 10-year anniversary

Plans progress for new community hub at Oast House on Tarmac site

evenoaks Town Council has completed a Feasibility Study exploring the future of the historic Oast House on Farm Road, in the northern ward of Sevenoaks.

It has long been the Town Council's ambition that this Oast House is restored and refurbished as a vibrant community hub and integrated with the rest of the town.

The Oast House sits on the 280-acre site of Sevenoaks Sand Quarry, owned by Tarmac. This area was first quarried in 1928, and sand extraction is due to cease in 2030.

Plans for the building include three community rooms, a kiosk/café and both internal and external toilets.

This new community facility will be particularly important given the planned residential development on the quarry site. The building will look to address needs of new residents in the area, help strengthen relationships, foster a sense of belonging and build community spirit.

The Oast House renovation project aims to protect local heritage, enhance the local community development, and enable sustainable community use of the building.

The Feasibility Study has been submitted to Tarmac as a

formal request for the transfer of the Oast House's freehold to Sevenoaks Town Council.

Powering a green future at Bat & Ball Centre

evenoaks Town Council has secured a £20,000 grant from the West Kent Rural Grant Scheme and Rural England Prosperity Fund to support the installation of solar batteries at the Bat & Ball Centre on Crampton's Road.

The Bat & Ball Centre is a community hub that supports a diverse mix of daytime and evening activities. It hosts events including weddings, meetings, conferences and classes.

The solar batteries will store excess energy produced from the centre's solar panels and make use of cheaper overnight

tariffs. This will enhance the building's energy efficiency and sustainability.

This initiative is part of the Town Council's Green Community Investment Plan, demonstrating our commitment to environmentally responsible projects that benefit the local area.

Sevenoaks' favourite businesses take

the spotlight

he Town Team hosts two of the most significant business events in Sevenoaks – the Business Show and the Business Awards. The Show is primarily a business-to-business event attracting around 30 exhibitors each year. The Business Awards is driven largely by the public, as customers and clients nominate businesses prior to their chosen enterprise submitting a detailed entry. This is then judged by a panel of local experts, this year from NFU Mutual, Specsavers, Barclays Bank, Go Coach and Warners, as well as Sevenoaks KCC Councillor, Sevenoaks Town Mayor, Sevenoaks District Councillor and Sevenoaks Town Council CEO/Town Clerk.

The public then swing back into action through the Customer Choice Award where they vote for their favourite. This year, there are 21 businesses competing for awards, and it is a measure of the public involvement that within the first 48 hours of the poll being open, over 1200 votes were cast. This is impressive for a town with a population of under



30,000 and given the poll is open for a fortnight!

The competition culminates in the Gala Awards Evening at the Bat & Ball Centre on 14 November, where this year, our speaker is Jenny Ryan, better known as "The Vixen" from TV's "The Chase", supported by local favourite magician, Bob Pound.

Over the last few months at House in the Basement (HitB) youth café, there's been a Girl's Pamper Night and Open Mic Night, as well as the usual fun and games.


The next Open Mic Night will be on Friday 5 December, see below.
