Earlier this year, Sevenoaks Town Council invited local children to take part in a festive challenge to design a Christmas light. A fantastic array of creative artwork was received from talented young people aged 11 and under.

This year's winner was Edeline, who drew a wonderful illustration of a Christmas Gonk – a whimsical figure with a long, bushy beard and pointed hat pulled over its eyes. Often compared to gnomes, Gonks originate from Scandinavian folklore.

This winning design has been brought to life and is now displayed in Sevenoaks, above the House in Basement youth café entrance, along with previous competition winners' lights.

On Thursday 4 December, Edeline and last year's winner, Caleb Wood, attended an official switch-on ceremony with their families. They were joined by the Mayor of Sevenoaks Cllr Tony Clayton, Cllr Libby Ancrum, as well as Chris Hugo and Ayush Gurung from the competition sponsor, Knocker & Foskett.

Last year's winning design by Caleb featured a candle shaped like an acorn with the word "Joy" written across it – a fitting symbol for Sevenoaks. Caleb's brother, Joseph, also received recognition for his competition entry.

Following the lights switch-on, the families were invited to enjoy refreshments at

House in the Basement youth café.

# **Sevenoaks Town Council assets**

The Town Council operates a wide variety of assets which need maintenance and improvements from time to time, we are currently managing:

**Vine Pavilion** – installation of new skylights. This Wednesday as the weather was kinder, the delayed work started on the rotten wood under the flat roof covering being addressed which had been preventing fixing of the new skylights.

**Buckhurst Play Area** – continuing with improving play equipment.

**Raleys Car Park** – works to address overgrown tree roots will commence next week.

**Rugby Pitches** – arranging demonstration to purchase new portable floodlights and seeking tenders for replacement of permanent floodlights.

St John's Hill Car Park public toilets – unfortunately somebody set light to the changing mat in the public toilet which has caused extensive damage and will take some time to repair. Insurance queries are also causing some delays.

**Greatness Pavilion** – the building project continues to progress well at these early stages with the contractor reporting being approximately two weeks ahead of schedule. Although some of this has been eaten up by waiting for delivery of steel. Find out more by reading weekly update reports at:

# Mayor's fundraising activities


#### Christmas raffles
