# It's now Full Steam Ahead!

Sevenoaks Town Council are delighted to announce that it has secured a £755,600 Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) grant towards the refurbishment of the Bat & Ball Station Building, thanks to money raised by National Lottery players.

The Bat & Ball Station Building is a Victorian property constructed in 1862. It was the first station in Sevenoaks and used by Queen Victoria when visiting Knole It has been boarded up since 1991 and gradually deteriorated

Cllr Roderick Hogarth, Chairman of the Community Infrastructure Committee, said "The Bat & Ball Station was once and now, with this significant grant from the HLF, will become again a wonderful asset for the community in Sevenoaks, especially the many hundreds of school children who use I daily and the growing number of people who will come to enjoy the facilities it will provide. The HLF grant enables the whole project (total value of investment approximately £1.3m) to move ahead and we look forward to opening this restored, Grade II Listed building in 2018".

The restored building will provide public toilets, two community rooms, and a café selling Kent produce and heritage information. It will also have the ability to sell train tickets. Currently there is only a ticket machine. All of these facilities should encourage more people to use the station.

#### MP Welcomes Station Regeneration

Sevenoaks MP Sir Michael Fallon has welcomed the news that Sevenoaks Town Council has secured a £755,600 Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) grant towards the refurbishment of the Bat & Ball Station Building.

Having helped the Town Council secure the funding, Sir Michael offered his congratulations. **He said: "Regeneration projects require huge community effort just to get off the ground.**So I congratulate the Town Council for securing the funding it needs for the project to go ahead I look forward to visiting the station in the New Year." - The Rt Hon Sir Michael Fallon











## Northern Sevenoaks Masterplan

As part of the Sevenoaks District Council Issues and Options Consultation respondents were asked to indicate their level of support for the proposals contained within the Northern Sevenoaks Masterplan: An ambitious plan which includes comprehensive community-led redevelopment of the current Tarmac Quarry site when extraction ceases in the next 10-15years.

Proposals include a new boating lake, a hire facility for boats / bikes, open recreation spaces, circular walking / cycle paths, new community facilities, residential accommodation, employment facilities, and greatly improved connections within Northern Sevenoaks.

District-wide support was 66%, but when only looking at responses from Northern Sevenoaks and the surrounding parishes this rose to 69%, indicating an incredibly strong level of local support for the proposals.

Sevenoaks Town Council is now working closes with Sevenoaks District Council to ensure the community-endorsed proposals are included within the emerging Local Plan, it is also progressing with its own Sevenoaks Town Neighbourhood Development Plan which will also support the proposals for Northern Sevenoaks.


