

4. Post Lockdown




5. London Poster Advertising

From the New Year Go Coach buses have hosted a series of bus-back adverts aimed at attracting people from its service areas into the town to "Shop, Eat, Relax and Enjoy".



Going further afield, the Town Team has arranged for advertising at Charing Cross where this poster is currently featuring on the station and escalators. WBF funded the cost of displaying the posters while STC funded the £500 cost of the poster design.



6. Social media

The new Town Team Facebook page is now operational. It should be noted that Facebook is (post Trump) very sensitive to posts relating to politicians and elections etc, and boosted posts come under scrutiny. One, has already been refused for this reason. Therefore, Councillors who feature in future boosted posts might find that their title is not included.

7. Public realm

The audit of items such as lamp posts, bins, benches and signs etc is nearly complete. There is a meeting of KCC, SDC and TT scheduled for 19th April, when the next steps will be discussed.

The TT has supplied The Sevenoaks Society with an inventory of the plaques which it has placed on historic buildings over the years and asked that they consider having them renovated. The Society responded to the effect that the plaques were given to the building owners and now form part of the building. TT is considering how to take this forward.



8. Wayfinding project

The draft strategy is in preparation by All Points West. This will be discussed at a joint KCC, SDC and TT meeting on 19th April. Topics will of course include the location and nature of the signage plus how the scheme could be funded, and if necessary, phased.

9. Spring Vegan Market

This takes place in Vine Gardens on Saturday 9th April. At the last market the live music proved to be a very welcome addition to the ambiance of the event and John Levett of the Listening Music Room Agency is thanked for organising it once again – and at no charge.

10. Britain in Bloom

This leaflet has been delivered by hand and discussed with the person on the counter, till or reception of the vast majority of the businesses in the town centre. Its content explains the importance of Sevenoaks having a great presentation for the Britain in Bloom Awards. It asks: "It would be great if all business owners would consider the condition of their premises, both inside and out, and look for ways of making improvements". It also asks that they consider that they dress their windows in the Jubilee colours.

All the pubs, restaurants and other businesses that have floral displays have agreed to use purple and gold this year, or, where needed, to ask Head Office if they can.

The leaflet also suggests that the businesses might consider advertising in the Souvenir edition of Town Crier and invites them also to become involved in the Children's Jubilee Trail.





11. Business Awards

The nomination forms have been hand delivered to the person on the counter, till or reception at the majority of town centre businesses, Bat & Ball Industrial Estates and Vestry Business Park.

Leaflet dispensers for the forms have been situated at the Bat & Ball Centre, Go Coach bus station, The Leisure Centre, The Library, Kaleidoscope, Specsavers, SDC offices and Stag.



Nominations have also been invited through the Sevenoaks Chronicle, TT website and STC Facebook page.

Entries have been received in all categories and judging will take place on 2nd June.

The speaker for the Awards Evening is Stuart Gillies, owner of the town's newest restaurant, No 8 and former CEO of Gordon Ramsay Group.



12. Sevenoaks Chronicle
