219 A25 BRADBOURNE ROAD SCHEME

The Committee received and noted the reply from Geoff Bineham (Kent Highways) to the feedback email sent by Deputy Town Clerk Hugh D'Alton following the on-site meeting which took place on 22nd July 2019.

Members expressed ongoing concerns over the scheme, including:

Replacement tree planting

It was suggested that the Town Council monitor the replacement tree planting, scheduled for Winter 2019, to ensure that the trees would be minimum of 13 feet in height and that adequate protection be put in place.

Planned removal of the "unsafe" pedestrian crossing

Members expressed continuing disappointment that the existing crossing could not be made safe, especially as it used by members of the public to access the bus stop outside the Council Offices.

It was once again questioned how the original installation had been approved by KCC in the first place, given that it did not conform to standards?

Road Markings

It was noted that the issue of the hatched area in the centre of the road had previously been raised with Mr Bineham at the on-site meeting on 22nd July. It was suggested that the Town Council contact Kent Highways again, to establish whether it would be feasible to narrow this area, while marking additional hatched areas at the sides of the road. It was anticipated that this would draw the traffic away from the pavement and parked cars.

Concern was also expressed regarding the lack of hatching at the entrance to the car park at the Town Council Offices.

It was agreed that the Town Council should request improved, regular communication and dialogue with Kent County Council with regards to highway matters, beyond the limited scope of the annually updated Highway Improvement Plan.

220 HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT PLAN (HIP) [Minute no. 169]

The Committee reconsidered the email dated 2nd July 2019 from Geoff Bineham at Kent Highways and the accompanying template.

The following areas were put forward as priority locations for possible submission to KCC:

- Sevenoaks Rail Station: Possible installation of a roundabout? It was noted that the possibility of a masterplan for this area had previously been discussed.
- The area around Waitrose and the fountain at the top of the High Street
- Sevenoaks Primary School and St John's CEP School
- Bradbourne Road
- St John's Road
- Hartslands Area (lack of pavements)
- Five-way junction at Vine Court Road/Holly Bush Lane/Hartslands Road/Bayham Road, as a possible location for the installation of a roundabout?

The issue of generally poor road conditions, including potholes, was also raised.

A review of SIDs (Speed Information Devices) was suggested, along with the possible extension of this programme.

It was suggested that Adrian Berendt of the "20's Plenty" campaign be invited to speak with Councillors about what might be feasible for Sevenoaks with regards to establishing 20mph speed limits.

Given that the 20mph issue is included in the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP), it was agreed that a comprehensive (as opposed to piecemeal) review of the whole town would be desirable, to be included in the referendum.

291 <u>SEVENOAKS DISTRICT LOCAL PLAN: INFRASTRUCTURE DELIVERY PLAN (IDP) MARCH</u> 2019

The Committee received Sevenoaks Town Council's comments on the (previously distributed) March 2019 edition of the District Council's Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP).

It was noted that the table of comments identified discrepancies between the content of the IDP and the aims and policies of Sevenoaks Town Council's draft Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP).

Concern was expressed that the IDP focused too narrowly on "hard" infrastructure, such as highways and transport and lacked detail on "soft" infrastructure, such as community facilities and Blue Green Infrastructure. It was reported that Sevenoaks Town Council was adopting a strong stance in favour of expanding the scope of the IDP, given that it would form part of the consideration for future Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding bids.

The Chairman therefore invited further comment and debate from members. The following issues were raised on the points contained in the table of comments:

Point 1: Consultation

It was noted that the Town Council had only been made aware of the IDP relatively recently and that town and parish councils were yet to be formally consulted on the document.

Point 2: Provision for Education

Given the additional provision necessitated by the building of up to 1,287 new dwellings, members emphasised the need for primary school places within walking distance, negating the need to travel by car or public transport. It was recognised that not all of these would necessarily be located within the proposed Tarmac Site, given that it is situated on the edge of the Parish.

The Committee was disappointed to note that the IDP fails to suggest a remedy for inadequate secondary school capacity, in particular for boys. It was also observed that it was unsustainable for around 1,000 pupils to continue to travel to Tonbridge and beyond.

With regards to Further Education, it was anticipated that provision might be established within the proposed Cultural Quarter for Sevenoaks.

Point 3: Cycle Routes

There was a consensus among members that the cycle and pedestrian route linking the Vestry Estate with Dunton Green (put forward by the Northern Sevenoaks Masterplan) should also be included in the IDP.

In addition, it was agreed that that the overall network of walking and cycling routes needed comprehensive revision to improve connectivity. To this effect, the Committee regretted the continued lack of alternative points of access to the Wildlife Reserve.

Point 4: Youth Services Facilities

The Committee expressed disappointment at the lack of commitment from Kent County Council to Youth Services in the Town, noting that resources were being concentrated mainly in other areas of the District.

It was hoped that new facilities would be provided in the North (as well as the centre) of the town, given projected housing development in that area.

Point 5: Blue Green Infrastructure

Members agreed that additional allotment provision for Bradbourne Vale Road should be included, provided there was no detrimental effect on the facilities of Bradbourne Riding Centre.

The following concerns were also raised:

Rail Capacity

It was suggested that the building of up to 1,287 new dwellings would increase the number of people commuting to London by around 800. However, the IDP makes no provision for this, despite the information being available in the Kent Route Study.

It was hoped that improvements to Bat and Ball Station and improved connections to London Victoria via Otford would help spread the capacity away from Sevenoaks mainline.

However, it was recognised that, even with improved public transport and cycling/walking routes, there would still be a need for increased commuter parking.

GP Provision

The need for additional GP practices was emphasised.

Access to the Tarmac Site

Given that Bat and Ball Junction is already severely over-congested, concerns were raised regarding the fact that there is currently only one route of access to the Tarmac Site. It was agreed that a Transport Review was essential to enable the development to be delivered on time.

292 YEARS ONE AND TWO FORWARD PLANNED WORKS PROGRAMME (2019/20 – 2020/21)

- (a) The Committee received and noted the email received from Technical Support Officer Abbie Mitchell at Kent Highways (5th September 2019) regarding the Forward Planned Works Programme for 2019/20 and 2020/21.
- (b) The Committee received and noted a copy of the August 2019 issue of the Programme, which includes details for Sevenoaks District on pages 41-45 (pages 53-57 of the agenda). Members observed that the Town seemed poorly represented, compared to other areas of the County.

It was resolved that Sevenoaks Town Council would respond to Kent Highways, expressing its disappointment and to suggest that the following roads be put forward for repair:

- Bayham Road
- Eardley Road
- Quakers' Hall Lane

However, Sevenoaks Town Council had that afternoon received notification from the District Council that the Planning Inspector had advised them to consider withdrawing the Local Plan from Examination and had cancelled the remainder of the Examination Hearings, due, primarily, to concerns around the evidence that the District Council had provided to confirm it had carried out its duty to cooperate with neighbouring Local Planning Authorities.

It was resolved that despite the likelihood of further delays to the Local Plan, Sevenoaks Town Council would continue to aspire to follow its schedule for the NDP, especially given that the policies and aims of the NDP will inform those of the Local Plan.

INFORMATIVE: It was noted that the Planning Inspectorate had yet to supply a detailed report on its findings with regards to the Local Plan and that this would be circulated to Members, once received.

An Economic Impact Assessment has been carried out and an application to SELEP made.

Planning Permission

Confirmation of approved Planning Permission for the Business Hub was received on 8th April 2019 subject to the following conditions:

- The external seating area shall only be used between the hours of Monday to Friday from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Saturdays from 8 a.m. – 1 p.m. The external seating area shall not be used on Sundays or Bank Holidays.
- Prior to the first occupation of the offices hereby permitted details of the provision of two electric vehicle charging points should be submitted and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Tenders

Sevenoaks Town Council sought tenders via the Government Contract Finder Website.

14 tenders were returned on 5th April 2019. The capital works element of the project had been budgeted at £159,100 (overall project £265,400). Tenders ranged from £213,950 - £424,529.

Some elements of the specification could be eliminated to reduce the cost.

SDC have reviewed the criteria for CIL applications with the next closing date for 30th September 2019 with a decision meeting in December 2019.

However, it should be noted that the introduction of electric vehicle charging points will increase costs.

Funding

Unfortunately, the Town Council did not receive the approval from SELEP in March 2019 as it was hoped. SELEP has stated that there might be further funding available in June 2019 (meeting arranged for 28th). There may also be the opportunity to apply for CIL funding in July 2019 – now likely to be deferred.

Option to Tax

Sevenoaks Town Council has applied to HMRC for Option to Tax on the Business Hub and been successful. Option to Tax enables the Town Council to reclaim VAT on refurbishment and construction costs.

vi) Community Rail Partnership

As part of the regeneration of Bat & Ball station and the Northern Sevenoaks Masterplan Sevenoaks Town Council, endorsed by the Friends of Bat & Ball Station have proposed to create a Community Rail Partnership (CRP) with the following key aims:

- Bring together 5 separate stations & Darent Valley Partnership to create the scenic route – Samuel Palmer Line
- Share promotion to encourage passengers to use the stations to visit local tourism attractions
- 3. Increased footfall to local tourism attractions at each station
- 4. Create a distinctive 'brand' for the line

Meetings are currently taking place with potential stakeholders for funding towards the project.

Following a recent trial, the Town Council would like to purchase with grant funding an electric bus for the award-winning No. 8 route to make it more economically viable and for environmental benefits.

It is hoped that the Town Council can make a CIL application in the future.

238. Bat & Ball Station

Refurbishment Project

The majority of the HLF Refurbishment project has been completed. There are some snagging works taking place, however the building including the café is operational and being promoted.

The HLF Activity Plan continues throughout 2019.

Access Ramp

Work on the ramp commenced in April 2019. Unfortunately, as soon as access was possible to Network Rail land and works commenced a High Voltage cable was detected with the result that works had to be initially stopped. Work recommenced keeping a safe distance from the cable. Considerable amount of time is being invested into negotiations and consultations with Network Rail and Southeastern in relation to the construction of the ramp in relation to the HV cable. In addition, the need to relocate the DOO cable was required as this had been installed within the shelter panelling and only detected when the back panel removed. This will unfortunately result in additional costs; discussions are also taking place with Network Rail regarding these.

The DOO cable was relocated overnight on 8th August 2019. Agreement has been reached for 'bridging works' over the HV cable for the ramp to be constructed.

An additional problem is the condition of the shelter on Platform 1. The Town Council has stated that it will not pay for the complete refurbishment of the shelter as this is currently Southeastern's responsibility. Southeastern have stated that they are not able to do this at present. The Town Council needs to make an opening to enable the access to the ramp and the opening needs to be structurally sound to support the rest of the shelter. Network Rail the owners of the structure must approve the structural work.

It was noted that the ramp was unlikely to open until mid-September 2019.

Ancillary Works

The Cycle Racks, additional streetlight and signage post have been installed adjacent to platform 2.

Installation of the Cycle Racks on the Community Centre site will be reviewed once the new centre hoardings / temporary access has been finalised.

Access to Otford Road. Details to be drawn up. Kent County Council are currently being consulted on land requirements. It appears that the land is designated as 'Highway Land' which makes it more complicated to release.

239. 3G Rugby Pitch at Knole Paddock

The need for a 3G rugby pitch at Knole Paddock was identified as part of Sevenoaks Sports Strategy. The facility would be available primarily for rugby but should also be available for other compatible sports. The project was part of the Sevenoaks Mayor's Fund.

Sevenoaks Town Council had submitted a planning application in November 2018 and were awaiting a decision.

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transport. The Town Clerk reported that the Youth Council had also raised concerns about transport costs, overcrowding and bullying behavior. She asked that the Youth Council's campaign to have the railcard scheme extended to 18 year olds be referred to KCC and that a volunteer scheme for a second adult on school buses, via PTAs, be considered.

- (ii) SAYT: Caroline Berry not present but reported that they had an applicant for the youth worker post recently advertised and hoped to interview next week.
- (iii) SDC Community Safety Team: No representative present but report provided which outlined steps taken to identify and follow up young people involved in incidents at the Bat and Ball Station; action taken to verify identities of young people stopped by Police Officers at the recent firework event in Sevenoaks and plans to issue Warning letters regarding their behavior. Relevant agencies had been informed of the forthcoming Christmas Lights Switch on event.

The Town Clerk reported that the sheer volume of young people arriving via the train stations and gathering (a group of 200) at the fireworks event was of concern and would be monitored at the Christmas Lights event: it was hoped that the Police would be offering support.

(iv) West Kent Communities: Charlotte Ede presented her report outlining recent youth work activity. She advised that there had been recruitment difficulties and a full review of youth services was being undertaken. She reported that KCC funded two posts and there were plans for the Lead Youth Worker (once in post) to sign young people up to a Youth Forum: the Town Clerk commented that in high level discussions KCC had agreed not to recreate a forum where one already existed so she did not anticipate this happening in Sevenoaks town.

West Kent Communities had offered to run a training course (funded up to £1000) for young people, joint hosted by the Town Council, in the House in the Basement Youth Café and suggestions for the course had been requested from Youth Café members and the Youth Council. The Youth Council had requested that consideration be given to dealing with mental health issues, including mindfulness, time and stress management skills. The Youth Café feedback would be provided shortly. Date for the course to be agreed.

CE advised that music recording facilities at Edenbridge were available for other groups to use free of charge and free travel could also be arranged.

351. MINUTES OF THE OPEN SPACES AND LEISURE COMMITTEE HELD ON 30th SEPTEMBER 2019

RESOLVED: The minutes of the Open Spaces and Leisure Committee held on 30TH September 2019 were signed as a true record subject to the following amendments: Cllr Clayton substituted for Cllr Camp and Cllr Piper was in attendance.

352. OPEN SPACES & CEMETERY MANAGERS REPORT

The report of the Open Spaces and Cemetery Manager was received and discussed, and the following matters noted.

i) Trees

Actions to previous resolutions regarding trees

The Woodland trust grants were only available to Schools and community groups, but it was noted that one of their approved growers was a town council regular supplier of native tree and hedging stock, being a member of the UK Sourced and Grown group of suppliers to the trust.

To progress the ability of members of the public to donate trees the town council would initially provide details in the Town Crier.

Potential dates for a tour of sites for new Councillors were Friday 6th or Monday 9th of December. Councillors were asked to contact the Open Spaces Manager.

Kent County Council had been contacted regarding its tree planting policy in relation to pavements, no response received to date.

The Sevenoaks in Bloom group would be meeting on 2nd of December at 10.00 am and would be discussing tree planting

ii) Greatness Cemetery Mess Room and Workshop

The messroom workshop building was reaching the end of its life, a timber construction and is uneconomic to repair with decay in most uprights and the roof structure, although it had had several repairs in the last few years particularly after break ins.

It had previously been resolved to replace this building and £25,000 and £6,000 from Rolling Capital Budget (not reserves) has been allocated from the Town Council's Community Infrastructure Levy funds.

To date one firm quotation had been received from a specialist company to supply and erect a new all steel wood clad building including all mess room fittings, plumbing and fixtures, electrics within the building strong steel doors and an adequate roof height which enabled all plant to be driven in for storage.

The cost for this was £38,000.

In addition, there would be a need to arrange temporary storage units for the plant and tools, deal with demolition and disposal, new electrical connection to the existing supply and connecting the mains water and cess pit outlet. Additional quotations being sought.

The Town Council wished to recognise the Government and KCC declarations for aiming for Zero Carbon and make its number one priority to integrate the aim within the vision and throughout the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) and within the Town Council's general operation. For its new buildings to be as sustainable and

eco-friendly as possible. Existing buildings to be improved to be more sustainable with reduced carbon footprint where practicable.

The Town Council would therefore commission an environmental audit of the proposed building and estimate the size of solar installation to off set the new build rather than merely reduce electricity consumption per annum. Rainwater harvesting was also a possible option although relatively little water was used in the messroom when compared with the whole site (public toilet, watering points, watering flowers).

Options to proceed

- 1. Continue with quotes for a steel building and arrange an audit of the building to estimate carbon offset needed.
- 2. Obtain quotes for a wooden building (lower environmental footprint but shorter working life and harder to make secure) arrange a similar audit.

Demolition and rebuild	£45,000

RESOLVED: To move forward with installing a new building and to research the payback for solar energy and seek advice from solar panel installers and Eco Electricity or similar suppliers.

RECOMMENDATION: To Finance & General Purposes Committee that authorisation be delegated to the Chairman, Vice Chairman and Town Clerk to proceed with the building requesting an additional allocation of £20,000 from Capital Reserve.

Pontoise Recreation Ground

The Town Council were successful in a grant application to the Ibstock Enovert Trust for £15,745.00 to replace the post and rail fence around the quarry face and replace three areas of safety matting under the older pieces of equipment in the play area.

The Grant offered was slightly lower at £15,000.00 less 10% from Town Council which would fund the scheme by £2,245.00 in total.

Work to replace the safety surface was due to start in November and the fencing by a separate local company Tyrrells in January.

Sevenoaks Rugby Football Club

At present the rugby club had a car sized garage attached to the Town Council's Knole paddock workshop building. It was constructed from the same brick as the workshop and was probably constructed soon after the workshop.

It was used to store the scrum machine and tackling pads and other kit. The amount of equipment stored has outgrown the building, the club also wanted to invest in some temporary portable floodlights to help with mid-week training in the winter, but would want to store these away each week.

Previously the club had suggested enlarging the store to double its size which could easily be achieved without visual impact on any nearby resident or loss of playing surface. An architect had drawn up plans for the Council to review.

RESOLVED: To request the District valuer to consider lease rent for additional store area when reviewing recommendation for rent for renewal of lease. Agrees in principle subject to planning and meeting all costs for the project and successful lease negotiation.

Congratulations were passed to the Open Spaces Manager and his team on the excellent condition of the Cemetery, War Memorial and Vine at the time of the remembrance services.
