The quorum of 3 elected members was met with 6 Town Councillors being present.

190. Apologies for Absence:

Apologies were received from Cllr Catherine Daniell.

191. Requests for Dispensations:

There were no requests for dispensations.

192. Declarations of Interest:

There were no declarations of interest.

193. Minutes of the Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy Working Group held on 7th August 2024 It was agreed to receive and accept the minutes as a true record.

194. Women, Outdoor Gyms, and Spatial Equality in the UK

The Working Group had received and noted the report from Fresh Air Fitness. The demand for outdoor fitness due to costs of indoor sports was noted as well as the concerns over safety and accessibility. It was noted that Sevenoaks Town Council had three outdoor gym facilities.

195. Sevenoaks Indoor Bowls Club Solar Panels: CIL Application

The Working Group noted the CIL application submitted to SDC by Sevenoaks Indoor Bowls Club for the installation of solar panels and solar batteries. It was noted that the Club had successfully submitted applications for numerous grants and that some were time sensitive and had asked STC to consider allocating £25K of CIL money to the project. This would be used as 'match funding' towards the SDC CIL allocation if successful. It was noted however

that the SDC CIL Board Meeting due to take place in December had been cancelled and it was not known what the new date would be.

The Working Group acknowledged the environmental and economic benefits of the project as well as the social benefits of the club and other clubs using the building, however it was also noted that there was CIL demand for many projects and large competition for funding.

RESOLVED: To **RECOMMEND** that the Finance & Delivery Committee consider the request for CIL funding.

196. Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy Review

The Working Group received and noted the updates in the Sevenoaks Sports Strategy Review Summary including a Freedom of Information request to SDC regarding s.106 monies to be allocated for indoor cricket facilities in the Sevenoaks Parish (See Appendix 1).

It was noted that SDC had granted the s.106 funds of £150,000 to Kent Cricket Welfare Trust, it was hoped that Sevenoaks Cricket Club would benefit from some of this, the balance was unaccounted for to date.

197. Sports Club Representatives – Updates

Updates were received from sports clubs and organizations.

Padel Court - It was advised that the planning application for padel courts at Hollybush had been passed subject to conditions.

STC – New grant availability to improve playing pitch which would need to be jointly completed with Sevenoaks Rugby Club.

Sevenoaks Hockey Club – It was advised that current pitch used for hockey play located at Trinity School did not meet the governing body standards after being re-laid, it was asked that any future refurbishing of pitch be completed to meet standards for competitive play.

Sevenoaks Football Club – The club had obtained four tenders for the new pavilion and advised that a value engineering exercise will be instructed to reassess plan so that cost would fit in within the budget. It was also advised that £650k was hoped to be granted for the project by The Football Foundation, application to be submitted January 2025.

Sevenoaks Sports Council – The Sports Council noted the value of sports for children in primary schools and had noted the importance of accessibility for all children.

Sevenoaks Suns – Difficulty in finding courts and players was noted as well as focus on expansion in primary schools. The club advised of future plans for a community sports hub located at Knole Academy which would also include facilities for other sports including badminton, pickleball and netball.

Sevenoaks Hockey Club – Outreach has been increased to state schools. It was also advised that age groups of players have expanded and that the club was looking into expansion for accessibility for persons with disabilities. The club mentioned how inclusive facilities and leases which do not solely focus on popular sports would be beneficial to the community.

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School Sports Provision – all present stated that they were disappointed that school provision for sports was not meeting relevant sports governing bodies requirements this limited the amount of community sport that can be played on the facilities. It was noted that the Sevenoaks Town Neighbourhood Plan had the following policy:

Policy S1: The Neighbourhood Plan will support the provision of new sports facilities across the town including the provision of new sports / watersports facilities at Sevenoaks Quarry (the Tarmac Site) at Greatness, which will be required to be delivered either in advance of, or in parallel with, new homes on this site.

All new sports facilities must adhere to sports governing body guidance for a particular sport (including schools) and should be developed with community access agreements.

The provision of new facilities, and enhancements and improvements to existing sports facilities across the town, will be delivered in line with the Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy.

198. Sevenoaks Town Sports Foundation

It was noted to the Working Group that the possibility of an independent Sevenoaks Town Sports Foundation was proposed, and that feedback would be appreciated. Local business Tarmac had advised of its potential support.

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STC Draft 2023 – 2024 Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy Review & Recommendations

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1. Background

The Sevenoaks Town Neighbourhood Plan (STNP) which was successful at public referendum in 2023 will require a lot of work in implementing its policies and aims. It also needs the supporting statements reviewed as they were created at the beginning of the process, although as the Planning Inspector stated the fundamental principles have not changed.



The Sports Strategy is one of the supporting statements requiring review, originally created in consultation with 40 sports organisations. Local sports clubs and organisations were invited in July 2023 to be involved in the review process.

The original final Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy document was published in 2015 and can be viewed as an appendix to the Sevenoaks Town Neighbourhood Development Plan (STNP) – see Appendix D on page 185 of the STNP via the following link: 4166 20230302-sevenoaksneighbourhood-plan-march-2023-compressed.pdf (wordpress.com)

The Sevenoaks Town Council Sports Strategy resulted in over £1.2m being invested into sports provision within Sevenoaks town. In addition, the new Bat & Ball Centre was built to enable floorbased sports e.g., Marshall Arts, Zumba, and outdoor tennis, netball and 5 aside football.

Sevenoaks Town Council receives its income via the domestic council tax payer. For capital projects such as improved sports provision it would need to seek external funding or use Community Infrastructure Levy income.

The Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy identifies sports needs for the town. A longer term project is required for identifying potential funding and land to meet the needs. This information is to enable all stakeholders to work together towards this aim and potentially use the information to share resources.

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2. Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy Working Group

Sevenoaks Town Council invited local sports clubs and organisations to participate in the review of the Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy. The Working Group was well supported with attendance from the following:

Terms of Reference for Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy (STSS) Working Group – Adopted on 4th October 2023 and Approved at Full Council on 13th May 2024

Aim: To create a second Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy and to establish sporting needs within Sevenoaks Town for the next 10 years in line with Objective 14 of the STNP (to deliver enhanced recreational and sports facilities for the town) and Policies S1 & S2.

1. Naming and role

1.1 The Working Group shall be referred to as the Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy Group (STSS).

1.2 Topics for consideration by the Working Group may be added, provided that they are within the scope of the Sports Strategy process and do not conflict or duplicate the work being carried out by another Sevenoaks Town Council (STC) Committee or Working Group.

1.3 Any proposed modification to the list of topics to be considered by the Working Group must be approved by the STC Community & Wellbeing Committee before they may take effect.

2. Membership

2.1 Excluding elected Councillors, members of the STSS shall be limited to representatives of Sports organisations within Sevenoaks Town.

2.2 Members of the STSS shall be, as far as possible, representative of the demographics within Sevenoaks Town.

2.3 The formal list of members of the STSS and all related General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) matters will be maintained and controlled by the Community & Wellbeing Committee.

2.4 Meetings of the STSS will be open to all members of the public who wish to attend.

2.5 Members of the public in attendance at a STSS meeting shall be free to contribute to the discussions taking place however will not hold voting rights.

2.6 Members of the STSS must disclose any personal or financial interests which may conflict or coincide with the topics being considered by the Sub Committee.

3. Governance and decision making.

3.1 The STSS will be presided over by a Chair or Vice Chair who must be an elected member of Sevenoaks Town Council.

3.2 If the Chair is not able to be present, meetings shall be chaired by the Vice Chair. If neither are present, members shall elect a Chair for the meeting from those present.

3.3 Decisions will be made by the consensus of formal members present at the STSS meeting. When a vote is tied the Chair will have the casting vote.

3.4 Recommendations made by the STSS will be considered as purely advisory and hold no weight unless explicitly ratified by Sevenoaks Town Council's Community & Wellbeing Committee.

4. <u>Meetings</u>

4.1 It is for the individual STSS to determine frequency of meetings; however, the frequency should be adequate to allow the STSS to meet deadlines set by the Community & Wellbeing Committee.

4.2 It is recommended that as soon as possible a schedule of STSS meeting dates is agreed and circulated to members.

4.3 Sevenoaks Town Council must be notified at least 5 working days in advance of any proposed meetings to allow them to be publicised adequately.

5. Record Keeping

5.1 Sevenoaks Town Council will endeavour to have an Officer present at meetings of STSS who will be responsible for the production of the minutes.

5.2 Minutes of meetings will be publicly available and will be publicised on Sevenoaks Town Council's website.

5.3 Agendas for the STSS will be circulated via email to all who have expressed an interest in the second Sevenoaks Town Sports Strategy process. Paper copies will be made available at the meeting.

4. Sevenoaks District Council Sports Provision Review

The SDC work is split into 2 strategies. They are the Playing Pitch and Outdoor Sports Strategy, which covers outdoor facilities, and the Sports Facility Strategy which covers indoor facilities. Each strategy is formed of 2 documents, a Needs Assessment Report and a Strategy Report.

The Needs Assessment Reports are an audit and analysis of existing provision, including supply (quantitative and qualitative), demand and future demand.

The Strategy Reports use this analysis to make strategic and site-specific recommendations. For the Sports Facility Strategy, this is broken down by facility type. For the Playing Pitch and Outdoor Sports Strategy, this is broken down by sport and analysis area. They centre around 3 key aims:

- 1. Protect to protect the existing supply of facilities where they are needed to meet current and future needs.
- 2. To enhance facilities and ancillary facilities through improving quality and management of sites (making better use of existing provision)
- 3. To provide new facilities where there is a current or future need to do so.

The strategies are complete and will be published on Sevenoaks District Council website in December 2024.
