- 2) To note Minute 465 of the Planning & Environment Committee held on 17th November 2025 regarding the **pending application for the Cross Channel Geopark to be granted UNESCO World heritage status** and to reaffirm the Town Council's support for the proposal.
- 3) That a press release be issued noting:
 - The proposed UNESCO Global Cross Channel Geopark, of chalk downland and supporting landscape, from Sevenoaks to Dover and beyond the Channel to the geological region on chalk as far as St Omer in northern France
 - The bid being prepared jointly by the Kent Downs National Landscape and the Parc Naturel Regional des Caps et Marais d' Opale with wide support from local communities

Sevenoaks Town Council

- The bid as a celebration of the relationship between the underlying geology, people, and natural and cultural heritage: it will help to protect the chalk landscapes in both regions, promote sustainable tourism and bring communities closer together through shared understanding of where they live

That Sevenoaks Town Council believes that:

- UNESCO designation will bring benefits to Sevenoaks and the surrounding area, strengthening protection for the two Sites of Special Scientific Interest within Sevenoaks Town, Bradbourne Wildlife Reserve and Knole Park, as well as for the River Darent chalk stream which flows through the northern part of Sevenoaks
- Designation will support environmental objectives in the Sevenoaks Town Neighbourhood Plan and respond to current climate change and ecological emergencies.

That Sevenoaks Town Council resolves to:

- To support the Kent Downs National Landscape Unit and the Parc Naturel Regional des Caps et Marais d' Opale in promoting the bid, working with other organisations and Local Authorities in Kent
- To raise public awareness about the Geopark and the benefits it will bring to the local community and natural environment
- To support the Kent Downs National Landscape Unit in reaching out to schools, students, young people and the wider community to help shape the bid and on projects that follow

Friends of Rheinbach

Cllr Dixon reported that Friends of Rheinbach had recently held their AGM and were pleased to have gained some new members. He advised that the Choir of Städtisches Gymnasium was performing at Knole Academy on 3rd December, the Friends of Rheinbach New Year dinner was being held on 6th February and that the summer visit from Freunde von Sevenoaks would take place in May/June. The Facebook page and website had been revamped with help from the grant from the Town Council. Cllr Dixon advised that members had very much enjoyed the talk by Sir Sebastian Wood, former ambassador to Germany.

Friends of Pontoise

Cllr Canet had attended the AGM of the Friends of Pontoise and reported that a motion had been passed that the May 2026 visit to Pontoise would be a celebratory closure of the 60 years of the town twinning organisation. It was noted that friendships would continue but that the organisation had recognised the diminishing number and advancing years of current members and the struggle to attract new ones and volunteers for committee roles and felt that it was no longer sustainable. Thanks were given to Michael and Evy Pembrey for their hard work in keeping the organisation going for so long. It was noted that Les Amis de Sevenoaks was experiencing similar difficulties.

Cllr Michaelides reported that she had attended a CPRE meeting, which had been discussing concerns about proposed new housing developments in the District Council’s Local Plan.
