69. Annual Town Council Report 2019/20

The Mayor presented the Annual Town Council Report for 2019/20, noting the achievements during the year. He thanked the Town Clerk and her team for their hard work during the year and especially the extraordinary effort in light of the challenges of the Covid-19 Lockdown period. Mention was made of the excellent progress on the Bat and Ball Community Centre in particular.

70. Stag Community Arts Centre

Council considered a report detailing the critical financial position of the Stag Community Arts Centre ("the Stag") due to the impact of the Covid-19 crisis, together with a recommendation from the Finance and General Purposes Committee held on 8th June 2020 proposing in principle that grant aid be awarded. A report outlining its Post Covid-19 Recovery Plan had been provided by the Stag, including an update received shortly before the meeting. Council members also received and noted the 1690 messages from the public and organisations of support for the Stag received to date, recognising the loyalty and commitment of the local and wider community. It was noted that c.£18,000 had been raised by the community fundraising appeal.

Councillors asked that their thanks be conveyed to the Town Council and Stag staff for their hard work during these difficult times.

Question from member of the public

The Town Clerk presented a question submitted by a member of the public: "Given that all Trustees of the Stag are publicly elected councillors, will the Council make it a condition of any funding to The Stag that its Trustee Meetings are open to the public and minutes published on the Town Council website?"

Council considered the recommendations of the Finance and General Purposes Sub-Committee as set out in the report.

It was noted that Kent County Council had been unable to offer any financial support to the Stag. Sevenoaks District Council had offered a loan to the Town Council which it could not legally accept_due to it not being capital expenditure; it was understood that the District Council was considering further whether a discretionary grant could be awarded to the Stag.

Revised resolutions were proposed by Councillor Bonin, seconded by Councillor Clayton, as set out below:

Sevenoaks Town Council is committed to keeping the Stag Community Arts Centre open and operating for the benefit of the residents of Sevenoaks. Therefore, Sevenoaks Town Council proposed to help the Stag achieve funding in the current fiscal year, in line with the Stag's Recovery Plan. It is noted that the Stag's Recovery Plan will develop as circumstances change and will need to demonstrate how the Stag will recover to a viable operation, as follows:

- 1. Sevenoaks Town Council will initially grant the Stag £65,000 in line with the request in the Recovery Plan, to cover the first three months of the Stag reopening.
- 2. The Stag launches a fundraising appeal, with Sevenoaks Town Council agreeing to match fund up to £60,000 achieved by the Stag.
- 3. Sevenoaks Town Council commits to revisit the Stag's financial situation on a quarterly basis, offering further grants if needed at the same time being mindful that the Town Council's revenue reserves should not fall to levels which would put at risk its own services to the Town.
